Purpose of Fund:

To award a scholarship to a deserving individual enrolled in the Master's Program in Information Studies at the University of Ottawa.

Eligibility Criteria:

1. Proof of completed undergraduate degree
2. Proof of acceptance in the Master's program in Information Studies at the University of Ottawa
3. Proof of Canadian Citizenship
4. Evidence of Community Service
5. References from three referees detailing the candidate's scholarship potential, personal qualities and community service
6. Official transcript of the candidate's University/College records issued by the institution

INSTRUCTIONS AND CONDITIONS

1. References from three referees are required detailing 1) the candidate's scholarship, potential, personal qualities, 2) work experience and 3) community service. Ideally, these references should represent more than one department and/or institution. They must accompany the application. Each letter of reference should be in a sealed envelope with the signature of the referee across the flap. The letter of reference for community service must be from a supervisor of volunteer work detailing activities and time commitment.
2. Official transcripts of all of the candidate's university/college records bearing the official seal of the institution must be either enclosed with the application or received independently postmarked no later than *noon May 28, 2010*.
3. The Committee assumes no responsibility for making inquiries beyond the papers submitted. All documentation with the possible exception of transcripts (see #2) must be included in the application package. The Scholarship will be based on academic achievement, volunteerism, future goals and personal qualities. The Scholarship is not renewable. The acceptance of the scholarship implies the obligation on the part of the successful candidate to devote him/herself to study or research as outlined in his/her application. The recipient is required to write a letter of acceptance of the scholarship and provide proof of acceptance into the proposed program of study within two weeks of receiving official notification by mail from the May Court Club of Ottawa.
4. The recipient of the May Court Club of Ottawa Susan Anderson Memorial Scholarship shall send two reports of his/her work to the Chair – the first to be submitted before the end of *January 2011* and the second at the end of his/her academic year of tenure. Each report is to be accompanied by a statement of progress and quality of the student's work from the professor or other supervisor.
5. The scholarship is payable in two equal installments. The first installment is payable in *September, 2010*. The second installment is payable in *February, 2011* upon receipt by the Chair of the Scholarship Committee of a satisfactory report.
6. The May Court Club of Ottawa should be recognized in the acknowledgments of any publications resulting from work done during the tenure of the award.
7. Applications and supporting papers will not be returned to the applicant, and become sole property of the May Court Club of Ottawa. Incomplete applications will not be considered. If there are no suitable applicants, this scholarship will not be awarded.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

- Letter of Intent should not exceed 500 words, typed or word-processed with the following information included:
 - a description of your short-term and long-term goals and future plans following completion of the Master's Program in Information Studies at the University of Ottawa, and projected application of research or study;
 - your personal motivation for embarking on such work;
 - challenges faced by you as a graduate student and future plans related to completion of this degree;
 - Demonstration of financial need.
- Resumé should provide a brief summary of professional work experience and any experience with teaching, research, publications and other professionally related activities, administration, business, volunteerism, and extra-curricular experiences.
- Letters of reference – three required – see instruction #1 (page 3).
- Photocopy of letter of acceptance to the program at the University of Ottawa.
- Photocopy of proof of Canadian citizenship, for example: birth certificate/passport.
- Transcripts from university/college to be sent to the Chair, The May Court Club of Ottawa Scholarship Committee, The May Court Club of Ottawa, 114A Cameron Avenue, Ottawa, ON K1S 1X1
